Also, remember after each holiday (Christmas, Valentine's Day, Easter, etc.) the stores will have the holiday items on sale. This is always a good time to pick up stuffed animals, stickers, etc. with these holiday themes.

The second Tuesday of every month until November, we meet in the Fellowship Hall from 5:00 to 7:00 to prepare items to put into the shoeboxes. All are welcome to join us as we work towards our 400 shoebox goal. Below is a statement from a shoebox recipient.

In 2001 a premature baby named Christopher Duffley was born to an unwed mother; the child was blind and on the autism spectrum. Doctors were surprised that he survived infancy, but he was adopted from foster care by the mother's aunt. At the age of four the child's teacher realized he had the gift of perfect musical pitch. At the age of six Christopher performed on the church stage the song, "Open the Eyes of My Heart." A video of his performance reached millions online. In 2020, Christopher shared his goals of serving as a disability advocate. He continues to prove that possibilities are limitless when the eyes of his heart are open to God's plan for him. As we ask God to reveal Himself to us, we can know Him more and can declare His name powerfully to others. We were reminded to ask ourselves, "How has God helped me to overcome obstacles or limitations within my life, as well as, others?" We should pray that God will open the eyes of our heart to better understand his mission for each of us!


Daylight saving time begins soon. Time changes on March 10th at 2:00AM so do not forget to move your clocks forward.
